Pastor's Reflection

This season of Advent is like no other...many of us may find ourselves feeling depressed as the season begins. Every day we hear of increased Covid-19 diagnoses, and every day the death toll rises. And even when we hear that vaccines are coming soon, the next story is that many Americans will not even trust those vaccines and so when *will* we be able to return to some form of normalcy? We were told to not travel at Thanksgiving and yet people are traveling, so will it be even worse in the days to come? In Pennsylvania, we are told that we will run out of hospital beds by the end of the year if we do not take more measures to slow things down. This Advent will be like no other.

Or will it? Let's think about that first Christmas...that was the year when there was Roman occupation and the Hebrew people *had* to travel to be counted in the town of their ancestors. (no planes, trains or automobiles back then) **That** was the year there wasn't enough housing for all the people who had to travel, and traveling circumstances were rough—no planes, trains or cars back then—and if you had a donkey, you would take turns riding while the other walked—or if your spouse was pregnant you walked the whole way while she rode. **That** was the year when people ended up sleeping in dirty, smelly, damp and chilly caves and barns. **That** was the year than an unwed pregnant woman almost got set aside by the man to which she was engaged.

But remember...that was also the year that God was at work in strange and new ways. There were angels showing up to young women and men, reminding them God was at work. There were angels showing up ALL OVER the place—to shepherds in a field. That was the year that God began showing a group of Wise Ones a star that they followed because they knew the child they would find was very special and would make a huge difference in the world as they knew it. That was the year that God came to us in human form and reminded us that no matter what our current circumstances God is doing something amazing and new.

Years ago, following World War II, a short poem was found carved on a cellar wall in Cologne, Germany. The cellar was a place where many Jews had hidden during the holocaust. The words of this poem have been translated, "I believe in the sun even when it is not shining. I believe in love even when I cannot feel it. I believe in God even when he is silent."

No matter our present circumstances, God IS doing something new. We might not be able to see what that is, but God is redeeming this world and seeking to permeate our lives now AND in the days ahead.

Making Christmas Luminaries



What You Will Need

- Plastic Milk Cartons/Jugs
- Sharp Scissors
- Tea Lights (to use larger/taller candles, make sure the flame is not too close to the sides of the carton)
- Something to use as a weight (such as sand, pebbles, or even just a couple of rocks).

What To Do

- Take your milk carton and rinse out thoroughly, I can't stress this enough! That last thing you want
 is a rotten milk smell.
- Soak your jug in warm/hot water to remove labels. Scrub gently to remove labels.
- Cut a flap, so that it is still connected at the top, on one side of the carton, about an inch or two (2.5 5 cm) from the bottom.
- Place your weight into the bottom of the carton, through the flap you have just made.
- Place the tea light flatly and stably on the bottom of the carton, between your weights.
- Remove the lid to your carton.
- Bring your luminaries to the church on Christmas Eve and put it out for all to see. Following our service you may take your luminary home and light it/them outside your home as a sign that the LIGHT OF THE WORLD is born!
- Sit back and enjoy!

Book Club Pick.... This Is How It Always Is by Laurie Frankel

In a time when we at Dover UCC have been asked to host the York County Transgender Day of Remembrance (see the article in this newsletter), what better way to prepare than to read this book! Have you ever had a family secret? Sometimes that secret doesn't get to be kept forever! This is a story about a family with three boys when a fourth boy is born. They know what to expect...they already have three boys. Laurie Frankel writes, "But Claude is not like his brothers. One day he puts on a dress and refuses to take it off. He wants to bring a purse to kindergarten. He wants hair long enough to sit on. When he grows up, Claude says, he wants to be a girl. Rosie and Penn aren't panicked at first. Kids go through phases, after all, and make-believe is fun. But soon the entire family is keeping Claude's secret. Until one day it explodes."

This Is How It Always Is, a novel about revelations, transformations, fairy tales, and family. And this is how it always is: Change is always hard and miraculous and hard again; parenting is always a leap into the unknown with crossed fingers and full hearts; children grow but not always according to plan. And families with secrets don't get to keep them forever.

Celebrate the journeys of our transgender brothers and sisters and join us in this read. The book is available on line in print or by audio and in the York County Library. DOVER UNITED CHURCH OF CHRIST ANNUAL CONGREGATIONAL MEETING November 15, 2020

Call to Order: The annual congregational meeting of Dover United Church of Christ was called to order by Church Council President Jeff Millford.

Devotion: The devotion was led by Sue McNeely.

Introduction of Council Members: Jeff introduced Steph Brown (Fellowship); Anna Gladfelter (Music/Worship); Annette Masenheimer (Treasurer); Tom Miller (Property/Grounds); Tonia Reinert (Evangelism/Outreach); and Pam Rutledge (Secretary)--all present at the meeting); Jim Markle (Membership)—present via Zoom; and Roxie Konzal (Faith Formation)--absent. Anna Gladfelter and Roxie Konzal are ending partial terms but will remain on Council for new terms. Annette Masenheimer is ending two terms as Treasurer; Spring Davidson has been nominated to fill that position.

Secretary's Report: Neil Stayrook moved to accept the 2019 Congregational Meeting Minutes as written; Spring Davidson seconded the motion. The motion was passed.

Treasurer's Report: Phil Brown questioned the reason for the increase in the overall balance, which Annette explained was a result of the Paycheck Protection (PPP) loan. Spring Davidson moved to accept the Treasurer's Annual Report as written; Tonia Reinert seconded the motion. The motion was passed.

Pastor's Report and Ministry Team Reports: Two corrections were made to the written reports: 32 shares were purchased for the GBIACK scholarships; 55 pounds of food and 15 pounds of personal items were donated to New Hope Ministries. Mary Duttera moved to approve the Pastor's and all Ministry Team Reports with the above corrections; Neil Stayrook seconded the motion. The motion was passed.

Continuing Business: There was no continuing business.

New Business:

- 2021 Budget Proposal: The 2021 budget remains the same as the 2020 budget with the exception of \$600.00 added for annual GBIACK scholarships and a \$500 AV line item. Neil Stayrook made a motion to accept the 2021 proposed budget; Anna Gladfelter seconded the motion. The motion was passed. Neil Stayrook offered a reminder that an audit should be performed.
- New Council Members (3-year term): The following members of the congregation have agreed to serve 3-year terms on Church Council: Anna Gladfelter and Roxie Konzal, continuing in their current roles, and Spring Davidson, assuming the Treasurer's position. Craig Duttera made a motion to approve the new Council Members; Pam Rutledge seconded the motion. The motion was passed.

- Worship Service Time: Neil Stayrook commented that due to the COVID-19 pandemic, there was not sufficient time to determine positives and negatives of the change in service time and suggested that we continue with the schedule for another year; Sue McNeely agreed with this position. Neil Stayrook made a motion to stay with the current schedule (adult faith formation at 9:00 a.m. and worship service at 10:00 a.m. from Labor Day until Memorial Day, worship service at 9:00 a.m. and no faith formation over the summer months). This topic will be revisited at the November 2021 Congregational Meeting to determine whether to make the time changes permanent. Sue McNeely seconded the motion. The motion was passed with all but one in favor.
- Sound System Proposal: Pastor Eva reviewed the proposal to upgrade the sound system for a cost of approximately \$30,000 with the funds to come from Grace Trimmer's bequest to the church. The upgrades will include improved microphones and sound in the sanctuary, large-screen monitors in the sanctuary, conference room, and fellowship hall, sound for the conference room, fellowship hall, and nursery, a portable sound system for use outdoors, and 10 assisted-listening devices for those who are hearing impaired. Neil Stayrook agreed that we are in need of improvements to our system and asked if the projected cost is inclusive of all that is needed. Spring Davidson explained that it is more cost effective for us to purchase monitors and other needed items rather than go through Spirit Sound. Jeff explained that an AV fund has been added to the budget to cover the cost of training and any necessary adjustments to the system. Pastor Eva shared that the new system should be in place by Christmas Eve. Tonia Reinert made a motion to accept the proposal for the new sound system; Neil Stayrook seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously approved.
- Christmas Eve Service: As there will be only one service this year, Tonia Reinert proposed that a poll be taken regarding preference for the time of the Christmas Eve service. Preferences for a 9:00, 10:00, or11:00 p.m. were counted, and the decision was made to have the service at 9:00 p.m. for this year only.
- <u>Miscellaneous Items</u>: Tonia Reinert suggested that consideration be given to refinishing the wear on the ends of the pews. Neil Stayrook recommended that we consider replacing our A/C system.

Reflections: Jeff commended the members of the congregation for their diligence in adhering to all the changes brought about by the COVID-19 pandemic. Anita Hensel offered thanks to Annette Masenheimer for her years of service as treasurer, and Dennis Hall reiterated the thanks to Annette and Phil Brown, who served previously. Loretta Hall offered thanks to Jim Markle and Sam Eby for the work they did in loading and transporting Grace Trimmer's furniture to Mt. Royal Auction.

Adjournment: Following the Lord's Prayer, the meeting was adjourned.
