This year, we will remember Ash Wednesday a little differently. On Ash Wednesday, you may worship at whatever time you please by watching a video that will be on our Facebook page. It will be scripture, poetry, and music, reflecting on why we remember Ash Wednesday and suggesting our theme for Lent. Then to receive ashes, you are invited to drive by the church either from 11:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. or from 6:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m., and Pastor Eva or Spring will meet you and give you a white mask with ashes in the form of a cross. The mask is yours to wear through the Lenten Season and beyond. (Just remember when washing it, the ashes will come out.)

The following thoughts by Fay Gentzler, recently put together in a book by her family, will form the theme for our Lenten time this year...

"There is a richness here—a gorgeous flowing richness of unending abundance. But, that doesn't mean it guides us. Our ways within and beyond our control speak of something different of lack of fear, of something other than an acknowledgement of God's endless river of grace. But, how do we step into the river? Do we step into it with trust? Do we trust the current of God's generous gifts? Or do we run from the river? For when we run from the river we turn away from God's abundance. Now is the time to begin something new. Now is the time to trust differently."

MISSION STATEMENT OF DOVER UCC...gathered in joyful community as children of God and brothers and sisters in Christ, we commit ourselves to the hearing, believing, and doing of His Word, shaping our lives by supporting one another, worshipping God, promoting justice and spreading the Gospel.

### Pastor's Reflection

Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of the Lenten Season. Where did this observance come from? In the early Christian church, the length of the Lenten Season varied, but eventually it began six weeks before Easter. This provided only 36 days of fasting (excluding Sundays). In the seventh century, four days were added before the first Sunday in Lent to establish 40 days of fasting—an imitation of Jesus' fast in the wilderness.

It was the practice in Rome (remember Christians were all catholic at the time) for penitents to begin their period of public penance on the first day of Lent by being sprinkled with ashes and dressed in sackcloth. They were required to remain apart until they were reconciled with the Christian community on Maundy Thursday (when the Last Supper would be remembered) and the whole community would celebrate the Eucharist. Eventually these practices fell into disuse (eighth to tenth century) and the church began the practice of placing ashes on the heads of the entire congregation.

There is NO mention of Ash Wednesday in the Bible. There IS a tradition of associating the wearing of ashes as a sign of repentance that predates Jesus. You can find references in Daniel, Esther, Samuel, Isaiah and Jeremiah that associate ashes with the act of repentance.

So what are we to do with this practice? Some say we do not need to wear ashes on our heads at all. Not all Christians follow this practice. Many do...and we will offer the wearing of ashes this year at Dover UCC. Why? I think it is especially significant to wear ashes this year. In a year when we have seen protests relating to Black lives being lost, terrorists from within the United States, police pushed to the brink, food lines lengthen, schools closed, businesses lost. In a year when we have lost so many lives to Covid-19, to remember that "we are dust and to dust we shall return" (as God said to Adam as he was told to leave the Garden of Eden) is to know that God formed us and it is to God we will return. As we distribute masks with the sign of the cross on them, we will remember we are God's and it is to God we will return—each of us in our own time. It is a sobering thought, AND it is a statement of faith. God is holding your life—we believe! The cross on the outside of the mask that we wear to protect others (and ourselves) from a deadly virus, is also a SIGN OF WHOSE WE ARE!!!

The number of cases is slowly coming down...the virus is changing to different strains because it wants to win...but we know WHOSE we are...and we *can double mask* AND *receive the vaccine* when it becomes available AND *wear our cross of ashes* AND *draw close to our God and one another*. And God will win out in the end! As we journey to Easter...when we will again say...Hallelujah!

#### DOVER UNITED CHURCH OF CHRIST CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING - MONDAY, JANUARY 11, 2021

Members present: Steph Brown; Spring Davidson; Anna Gladfelter; Jim Markle; Tom Miller; Jeff Millford; Pastor Eva O'Diam; Tonia Reinert; and Pam Rutledge. Roxie Konzal was absent. Neil Stayrook was also in attendance for a portion of the meeting.

Jeff opened the meeting at 6:32 p.m. Pastor Eva shared concerns and a prayer.

**Secretary's Report:** Minutes from the December 2020 meeting were reviewed. Tonia moved to accept the minutes; Anna seconded the motion. The minutes were unanimously approved.

#### Treasurer's Report:

• There was no December treasurer's report, as Spring did not receive needed information from Sue McNeely. Therefore, both the December and January treasurer's reports will be given at the February Church Council meeting.

#### Special Discussion:

- Neil Stayrook asked to have a written request, stating the amount of money to be transferred from the treasury from Grace Trimmer's estate to the General Endowment Fund. Spring made a motion to move \$310,000 from the checking account to the General Endowment Fund; the motion was seconded by Jim and passed unanimously. Jim will forward the written request to Neil, Spring, Pam, and Sue McNeely.
- The Empowerment Team has been formed with Neil serving a chairperson. The team members are Mary and Craig Duttera; Annette Masenheimer; Barb Kimpel; Patrick Swatsworth; and Nicki Shepski. Mike Gibbs will serve as coach. Due to a grant, there is no cost for the

sessions. The first meeting of the Empowerment Team will be held on Saturday, January 23, 2021.

Pastor's Report (discussion points were as follows):

- Discussion was held regarding returning to in-person worship. Tom, Pam, and Tonia spoke in favor of returning to worship for those who feel comfortable doing so. However, Spring then shared the COVID statistics for York County and expressed the concern that it is not safe to return to worship at this time. Steph spoke in agreement with Spring's position. Pastor Eva felt that there are church members who really need to be present for worship. After further discussion, Tom moved that up to 10 attendees may be present for worship by calling the church office from 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. Tuesday through Thursday to reserve a space. Tonia seconded the motion, which was passed unanimously. This discussion will be revisited at the February Church Council meeting.
- Discussion followed regarding the Scouts' use of the church. Tom raised the question whether there could be any legal issues for the church. Pastor Eva will look at the insurance policy. Council members agreed that the Scouts may return to meeting at the church provided that they follow the posted safety protocols (i.e. masking, distancing, and sanitizing).
- The person who has been staying at the church seems to be following the written agreement with the exception of asking to be let in at inconvenient times.
- Pastor Eva is tentatively planning "drive-by" times on Ash Wednesday (February 17, 2021) for those who wish to receive the imposition of ashes. The sign of the cross will be placed (using ashes) on face masks, which will then be distributed to those attend.
- Heritage Senior Center sent a letter asking for contributions to their building fund. For a contribution of \$3000, a plaque of recognition will be placed in the new building. As Dover UCC has a long history with the center, including volunteerism and participation in the services provided, it was agreed upon to support the building project. Anna Gladfelter made a motion to contribute \$3000 from Grace Trimmer's estate to the Heritage Senior Center building project. Jim Markle seconded the motion, which was unanimously approved.
- The sound system installation is well underway and will be completed as soon as ordered components are available.

### Around-the-table Discussion:

- Tom is seeking bids for painting the peeling window frames in the sanctuary and on the windowsill near the outside mail slot. Pastor Eva mentioned that there is a window frame in her office that is peeling and a light outside her office door needs to be replaced. The repaired plaster going down the steps also needs to be painted at some point. Other future items to be considered are the resealing and painting lines of the parking lot, refreshing the varnish on some of the pews, and replacing the carpet in the sanctuary.
- Tonia shared that the response to the New Hope Christmas Blessings was outstanding and food donations continue. She will share a Mission Moment for Heritage Senior Center on Sunday, January 17.
- Jim reported that the attorney who was handling Grace Trimmer's estate has retired, but his son will continue with the remainder of the estate matters. A check of around \$58,000 is still anticipated.
- It was suggested that an audit of the books be performed. Pastor Eva will ask Phil Brown if he will perform the audit.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:57 p.m. Jeff closed with the prayer of St. Francis. The next Council meeting will be held on **Monday, February 8, 2021, at 6:30 p.m.**
