Pastor's Reflection

Yesterday, I attended a Penn Central Conference Ministerial Excellence Forum held in Linglestown at St. Thomas UCC. It was on dealing with politics in the church. In a time when we are preparing for the primary election in Pennsylvania, it was a timely discussion. We were reminded that Jesus was political. The definition of "politics" involves activities associated with the governance of a country or other area (such as the church), especially the debate among people having or hoping to achieve power. Our presenter, Rev. Dr. Carrie Call, our Designated Conference Minister, suggested that when something is political, it always involves power.

Consider when Jesus took on the powers that were present in his day...debating with the religious leaders, encouraging people to have their allegiance to God and not to Rome, touching those lives on the margins of society. Why were they on the margins of society? Because someone had deemed them unclean. Someone who was in "power" whether in the church, the government or society had determined that women were not equal to men, that lepers needed to remain separated from their families and society, and Jesus took on those powers and transformed them through the power of God's love.

Sometimes, we run into these issues, and don't even realize it...Several pastors in the community of Dover became aware of the fact (there was an article in the paper reporting from the last Board meeting) that Dover Area School District food service has a current total lunch debt in excess of \$35,000. This is debt that has accrued (and continues to accrue) throughout the school year. All families are alerted prior to the school year to apply for free or reduced lunches if the need is there. This needs to be filled out each year.

But during the school year, family circumstances change. Jobs are lost. Medical issues arise, along with the bills that come with those issues. Death of parents or guardians occurs. And families find themselves not able to pay for school lunches or having to decide whether to pay the rent or utility bills or for school lunch. No child is refused a lunch. And if a family has to decide whether to keep a roof over a child's head or pay for their lunch (which they will receive whether it is paid for or not) they will keep a roof over their head. School lunch debt adds up.

When I shared that churches were planning on having a pancake breakfast and contributing the proceeds to this need, one response was, "Take the parents to court and hold them responsible." The school board is turning over to collection those who could pay but are choosing not to...that is not the case with most families. Another response was, "They will just take the money from somewhere else. It will be paid." It will, but it will take that money from other programs important to our children's education.


James 2:15-17 says, "Suppose a brother or sister is without clothes and daily food. If one of you says to them, 'Go in peace; keep warm and well fed,' but does nothing about their physical needs, what good is it? In the same way, faith by itself, if it is not accompanied by action, is dead." Having a pancake breakfast is something we do all the time. Would it hurt us to join with other churches and contribute the proceeds from one pancake breakfast to this need in the community? We have the power to make a difference in some people's lives. The school will decide how to use these funds and whose debt will be cancelled. They know the needs of each of these families. We will not pay off the entire amount. But we will let the families in this community know we care! ***Join us March 14—Buy Breakfast to Pay For Lunch!—volunteer to help cook—bring your family, neighbors, friends and coworkers—from 7 am to 10 am—we will have 3 locations to buy breakfast—here at Dover UCC, Friendship Community Church or Calvary Lutheran Church.*** Let's join the community and make a difference!



The UCC Environmental Ministries and Interfaith Power and Light are partnering to plant trees for the 50th Anniversary of Earth Day in spring 2020. Additionally the Keystone 10 Million Trees and the Chesapeake Bay Foundation (CBF) have made a commitment to plant 10 million trees in Pennsylvania in 10 years. This is a great opportunity for our churches. CBF is looking for land-owning congregations who want to plant trees on their property and who want to partner with CBF in planting the trees and tending the young trees to give them a healthy start. Native trees are provided as well as instruction on how to plant and where to plant on the property to help keep rainwater run off out of the streams and waterways.
