Reflections from the Pastor

The verdict is in and Derek Chauvin has been convicted of murder. Black lives do matter. We can breathe again...It is over. Think again. It is not over. This is only the beginning, not the end of the story. It would be like thinking that because one mass shooting was stopped, there will never be another. Or because one person prevented an Asian American from being accosted, none would ever be abused or beat up again. Or because I began recycling in earnest, climate change would be reversed.

We face major issues in this country and around the world. But no issue is so large that we cannot face it together. Jesus taught us that. He appeared to his followers after the resurrection to remind them that they were not spreading the news of God's love alone. He would be present. The Spirit would lead. Though some days would feel too difficult and the job would seem impossible, together, they would continue what God had begun through Jesus.

Today in a devotional, paraphrasing that familiar Psalm 23 that says in part, "He leads me in paths of righteousness for his name's sake. Even though I walk through the darkest valley, I fear no evil..." the author, Steve Garnaas-Holmes, suggests, "The paths of righteousness lead through the dark valley, don't they? Lead me anyway. I will follow you, not my fear. Even there I shall not want." If we will see that the way to God's love leads us into difficult conversations—if we will see that to be in right relationship with God and each other we must walk in some very dark valleys—and let God lead us there together, we will begin to change racist attitudes, understand that caring for God's creation is OUR responsibility, and will demand respect for ALL people.

An old folk song says, "One man's hands can't tear a prison down. Two men's hands can't tear a prison down. But if two and two and fifty make a million, we'll see that day come round." It is time we stop seeing these issues as one person issues. This is not an issue of George Floyd or Derek Chauvin. These are larger issues of OUR society. If we will see that all of these issues are OUR issues, then we will see liberty and justice for all.

Girl A by Abigail Dean is described this way by bookbrowse.com: "She thought she had escaped her past. But there are some things you can't outrun. Lex Gracie doesn't want to think about her family. She doesn't want to think about growing up in her parents' House of Horrors. And she doesn't want to think about her identity as Girl A: the girl who escaped, the eldest sister who freed her older brother and four younger siblings. It's been easy enough to avoid her parents—her father never made it out of the House of Horrors he created, and her mother spent the rest of her life behind bars. But when her mother dies in prison and leaves Lex and her siblings the family home, she can't run from her past any longer. Together with her sister Evie, Lex intends to turn the home into a force for good. But first she must come to terms with her siblings—and with the childhood they shared."

The month of May is designated as Asian/Pacific American Heritage Month.
