Reflections from the Pastor

Have you noticed the colors around us lately? The green on the trees, the iris in purples and whites and yellow, the azaleas in pinks and reds? The peonies coming into bloom...the yellow of the coreopsis? Is it just me? Or do the colors strike you as more brilliant this year? I believe it has to do with the pandemic...not that Covid made the colors any different, but living through a time of isolation and too much death makes the coming of Spring even more sweet. I don't know about you, but it makes me appreciate the earth more and the Creator who brought about such diversity.

Psalm 24:1-2 reminds us, "The earth is the Lord's and all that is in it, the world, and those who live in it; for he has founded it on the seas, and established it on the rivers." We are called to be stewards of this earth and co-creators with God to care for this amazing creation. Pope Francis said in 2015, "Everything is related, and we human beings are united as brothers and sisters on a wonderful pilgrimage, woven together by the love God has for each...and which also unites us in fond affection with brother sun, sister moon, brother river and mother earth."

We have been looking at climate change in our Sunday Faith Formation group. You don't think that's an issue of faith? If the earth truly belongs to God, and God has given that gift of creation to us to use wisely, then indeed, how we care for this planet AND how we care for each other is indeed a matter of faith! I may feel like I cannot change what oil companies and natural gas companies do or feel like I can even change my legislator's mind, but we CAN and NEED TO MAKE A WITNESS in the care of God's creation.

With that in mind, we will be doing several things this summer. We will worship out in creation once a month. (In case of rain, we will move indoors.) Our Sunday Morning Faith Formation class has agreed to organize recycling as a faith community. We plan to begin working with Penbrook UCC in recycling things that they already are recycling. If we are really successful, we will launch our own program. We will do a book study on Tuesdays in the Park that centers on the process of grounding ourselves in the world to find God. And we will relaunch Tuesday Morning Chatters in Cousler Park the last Tuesday of the month. You will also be invited to share several Mindfulness Walks with me during the spring, summer and fall.

It is a time when we need to reimagine the church as the community of faith and witness to God in our world. Find a way to connect! If you are struggling with connecting back with the faith community, let me know and we can talk about that. It won't be easy for some of us, but together, we CAN!



Thursdays In The Park

This summer, instead of meeting at church for a Bible Study, I will be meeting anyone who would like to read and discuss the book *Grounded: Finding God in the World* by Diana Butler Bass. The book is available through www.amazon.com for anywhere from \$3.99 to \$25.76. There will be five sessions, all Thursdays at 4:00 p.m. — June 24, July 8, July 22, August 5 and August 19. We will begin at Ketterman Park in the pavilion, and then move to other parks, depending on who comes. (Bring the name of your favorite Park.)

There is a major transformation that is happening in the world in how people understand and experience God. “The distant God of conventional religion has given way to a more intimate sense of the sacred that is with us in the world. This shift, from a vertical understanding of God to a God found on the horizons of nature and human community, is at the heart of a spiritual revolution that surrounds us — and that is challenging not only religious institutions but political and social ones as well.

Grounded explores this cultural turn as Bass unpacks how people are finding new spiritual ground by discovering and embracing God everywhere in the world around us—in the soil, the water, the sky, in our homes and neighborhoods, and in the global commons. Faith is no longer a matter of mountaintop experience or institutional practice; instead, people are connecting with God through the environment in which we live. *Grounded* guides readers through our contemporary spiritual habitat as it points out and pays attention to the ways in which people experience a God who animates creation and community.” Join in this emerging spiritual revolution, find a revitalized expression of faith, and change the world!

How Can You Care for God’s Creation?

We are called to be caretakers of God’s Creation! Seems like too big of a job? How about beginning with determining your carbon footprint? <https://www3.epa.gov/carbon-footprint-calculator/> This link will walk you through figuring out how your living is impacting the earth. Then consider what you can do to reduce that footprint.

Recycling is one thing we can all do. If you recycle in the ways that Penn Waste offers, you have only scratched the surface. Council has agreed to allow the Sunday Morning Faith Formation group to begin to help us recycle. There will be several containers in the fellowship hall for various recycled materials. Did you know you can recycle oral care products (toothpaste tubes and caps, dental floss containers) and deodorant containers? You can also recycle shaving-related products (razor blades and packaging), makeup container, CD’s, DVD’s and their packaging, aluminum can tabs and glossy catalogs and magazines....and so much more. We will be distributing a list of about 15 different recycling items we can take. Make sure you get a list! They will be distributed at church, but if you want one mailed to you, call the office. If you are willing to assist with this ministry, let the pastor know.

FROM THE OPEN AND AFFIRMING MINISTRY TEAM

On Sunday, June 6, those who watched the five-part PBS documentary series, *Asian Americans*, are invited to join in a discussion of the series following the worship service. If you have not seen them yet, the link is www.pbs.org/weta/asian-americans/watch/. There are 5 sessions, watch one or all, each one just under an hour in length. Episode 1: Breaking Ground; episode 2: A Question of Loyalty; episode 3: Good Americans; episode 4: Generation Rising; and episode 5: Breaking Through. The discussion will focus on the central question of the series, *As America becomes more diverse and more divided while facing unimagined challenges, how do we move forward together?*

Wikipedia defines **gay pride** as “a positive stance against discrimination and violence toward lesbian, gay, bisexual, and transgender people to promote their self-affirmation, dignity, equality rights, increase their visibility as a social group, build community, and celebrate sexual diversity and gender variance.” LGBTQIA+ Pride Month is celebrated each year in June to honor the 1969 Stonewall uprising in Manhattan, which is considered the turning point for the Gay Liberation Movement in the United States. Celebrations include festivals, parades, concerts, workshops and memorials. Here are five reasons why Pride events are for **everyone**:

1. Your LGBTQ child, sibling, parent, grandparent or friend will appreciate knowing that you are an ally who is proud of them.
2. Participating in Pride events can make you a better ally by educating yourself and sharing that information with others.
3. Pride events are good for the community, showing that you live in a loving and welcoming place.
4. Pride demonstrates strength in numbers, showing that millions of people believe in full rights and equality for LGBTQ people.
5. Pride activities are fun and help to energize people to keep pushing equality forward!

The Rainbow Rose Center, York County’s LGBTQIA+ resource center, will virtually host York County Pride (formerly Equality Fest) on Saturday, June 5, via a live YouTube stream. 
Community Pancake Breakfast




