Open and Affirming Covenant



According to the website of the National Council of Churches, World Communion Sunday began in 1936 in the Presbyterian Church and was adopted by the Federal Council of Churches (predecessor of the National Council of Churches) in 1940 Since that time, the celebration has grown into an international celebration of Christian unity. It is a time when we mark the almost universal Christian practice of breaking bread with one another, remembering what we refer to as the "Last Supper" and Jesus' sacrifice. Jesus' example to us was to "Go and do likewise." Invite someone to the table that you would not normally invite. How about sharing the Way of Jesus with someone that doesn't necessarily believe as you do? We will provide the communion for those who worship in person in a small disposable chalice with bread on one side and juice on the other. If you are worshipping in person OR at home, YOU PROVIDE the invitation to someone with whom you do not usually commune. Remember if it is in person—we wear masks! So have one ready for the person you bring! It is a Sunday we celebrate unity in the midst of worldwide diversity!

Reflections from the Pastor

I am blessed. Blessed by you! Blessed by the gifts of God in my life—from the air I breathe to the home I share with Mary to the congregation (YOU – Dover UCC) that I am privileged to pastor. You see, I was in a conversation this past week with some leaders in the community and our school social workers in Dover Area School District. I was reminded in that conversation that we are recognized in the community as a faith community that cares. And we live in an area where that is NOT taken for granted!

Wait...not everyone cares? No! Our social workers reminded us that issues of racism and acceptance of lgbtqi (lesbian/gay/bi-sexual/transgendered/queer or questioning/intersexed) people are issues in our schools. Children are not accepted and make fun of those who are different. Teachers worry about how to approach these issues without getting into trouble. There are people who do not care about those around them who refuse to wear masks to protect themselves and others during this Covid epidemic...even though the youngest and most vulnerable cannot receive vaccines yet.

At Dover UCC, we stand out. We stand as ones who have promised to follow the example of Jesus...which means we will love and care for those who are marginalized in any community – especially in Dover – but in Kenya as well! We will strive to welcome those who feel marginalized. We will wear masks so children and those who are vulnerable, will be less likely to get Covid—and the flu too! We educate ourselves on issues of racism and economic injustice and homophobia. In our scholarship, we target those who will not make it through a 4 year college program, but have technical skills that will serve well. We make breakfast for young people who struggle in traditional classrooms and pack food for children to eat on the weekends, when they may not have the nutrition they need.

We are called to live out that welcome...that love! We are called to witness to this community and the world how to live out the love of God! We are called to bear witness to being God's Open and Affirming Presence in Dover. We are called to invite others to be that presence in Dover!





Remember when we began filling backpacks (plastic bags, actually) with food for children to have over the weekends? We began doing this at New Hope in Dillsburg (There wasn't enough space in Dover). We began by doing it in the summer, then we did it year round...one day a month...shared with other churches. Then Covid hit and we stopped doing a lot of things....Well, school is back in session and there are families that are in need of food for children over the weekends. (Did you know that according to 2019-20 data, 47% of students receive

a free or reduced price lunch?) Often parents work on weekends and children are left to get their own lunches. So we, along with New Hope in Dover, other churches and the school social workers, Kirsten Johnson and Niccole Assi, will work to solve this issue.

Dover UCC's has been assigned one week each month (usually the last week) to go and fill backpacks (actually plastic bags) that are then transported to the elementary schools for students. NEEDED are 3 or 4 volunteers each month. Our first packing date is September 29. We will carpool from the church to New Hope in Dillsburg until construction is completed on the Dover facility. We will leave at 9:30 a.m. on Wednesday morning on the days we are scheduled. Each time we do this, we will put together food for about 100 children who will have food for the time they are not in school.


