Reflections from the Pastor

The number of Covid cases are rising again. The number of deaths is on the rise. Most of these deaths are from those who have not been vaccinated. Remember...not everyone can medically receive the available vaccinations. Some have medical conditions that do not allow them to receive the vaccination and some are. too young. It is important that we work to protect the young and the vulnerable during this time.

This pastor is tired of having to write again about Covid. I wish, as I am sure we all do, that somehow it would just go away. It will, but not without the work of all of us. I want to thank this congregation! The celebration of my 40 years in ordained ministry was just what this pastor needed to have the energy to continue on! I, like many pastors, want to have the time to visit not just those in nursing homes, but everyone in the congregation. But so much time is taken just keeping up on what this nursing home requires, or that nursing home, or hospital...that it has not allowed for the ongoing nurturing of all the people in the congregation.

Indeed, people who have had to work at home, have quit their jobs, feeling they want more. Others who have had to be working from home, are unsure when they are now being asked to return to an office setting about whether they will be exposed and bring something home. It is a difficult time.

Yet I pray that everyone can receive the kind of encouragement I received when we celebrated my ministry. Each of us has a ministry that needs to be celebrated! Even if you feel stuck at home, you can encourage neighbors and friends by picking up the phone...or better yet, write a note and put it in the mail. Celebrate those around you! Encourage those around you! It makes ALL the DIFFERENCE in the WORLD!

And thank you! I have known that encouragement! From you!!!! It means so much to me to know the support of this faith community. Let's spread that encouragement so everyone can know that energy to continue to live and work among today's challenges!

Another Opportunity! The filling of backpacks for school children is baaaaack!

Remember when we began filling backpacks (plastic bags, actually) with food for children to have over the weekends? We began doing this at New Hope in Dillsburg (There wasn't enough space in Dover). We began by doing it in the summer, then we did it year round...one day a month...shared with other churches. Then Covid hit and we stopped doing a lot of things....Well, school is back in session and there are families that are in need of food for children over the weekends. (Did you know that according to 2019-20 data, 47% of students receive a free or reduced price lunch?) Often parents work on weekends and children are left to get their own lunches. So we, along with New Hope in Dover, other churches and the school social workers, Kirsten Johnson and Niccole Assi, will work to solve this issue. Dover UCC's has been assigned one week each month (usually the last week) to go and fill backpacks (actually plastic bags) that are then transported to the elementary schools for students. NEEDED are 3 or 4 volunteers each month. Our first packing date is September 29. We will carpool from the church to New Hope in Dillsburg until construction is completed on the Dover facility. We will leave at 9:30 a.m. on Wednesday morning on the days we are scheduled. Each time we do this, we will put together food for about 100 children who will have food for the time they are not in school.
