Worship January 9th – 30th The Gospel According to Harry Potter!

The music and worship team have put together a fun experience for worship and fellowship in January for Dover UCC. From January 9th to the 30th we will celebrate *The Gospel According to Harry Potter* (based on a book by the same name by Connie Neal).

The first thing you may notice when you come to worship on January 9 is that you will be met by someone with a "sorting hat." If you watched the movie, *Harry Potter and the Sorcerer's Stone* at the church the week before, you will know that there are four houses at the Hogwart's School of Witchcraft and Wizardry. Each house has certain values...

- Gryffindor values courage, bravery, nerve, and chivalry. ...
- Hufflepuff values hard work, patience, justice, and loyalty. ...
- Ravenclaw values intelligence, learning, wisdom and wit. ...
- Slytherin values ambition, shrewdness, and are often destined for greatness

We will invite you to experience the sorting hat and sit in the section of the sanctuary where your house will be seated. If you are a parent (and do not trust your child to sit on their own) you may choose to not draw and go with your child or if you are in a couple or group that feel you must sit together, then only one person should draw from the sorting hat and the other(s) may sit with the one who has drawn.

- Josh and Jess Markle will bring their leggo Hogwart's School (the school that Harry attends) and have it in the sanctuary for the month of January.
- Each week, the *time with the young at heart* will center on a character from the Harry Potter stories. If you have a favorite character and are young at heart, share your favorite character with Pastor Eva and she will be sure to use your character one Sunday.
- Each Sunday, you will hear about another portion of Harry Potter's story and how it relates to scripture and our faith.
- We will have all sorts of sweet treats made by us AND some from the Harry Potter Store.
- On Friday, January 14, we will host a fellowship event, Dinner and a Movie, where we will eat Harry Potter recipes and watch the 2nd Harry Potter movie, *Harry Potter and the Chamber of Secrets*.

Who said church couldn't be fun! We will have fun AND learn some spiritual lessons at the same time! Join in the fun...and remember to bring your family and friends!!! Especially the Young At Heart both young and old!

Reflections from the Pastor

How is it that I began reading Harry Potter books? When our grandchildren brought the first one to us and said, "You need to read this!" That is how I began reading the Harry Potter series. When I found Connie Neal's book, *The Gospel According to Harry Potter*, I loved the snippets from Harry Potter laid out as spiritual lessons.

At one time, it was the Gospel According to Peanuts or I even heard of one pastor developing a whole series on The Golden Girls! I took a course in seminary called "The Gospel According to Mother Goose" where we looked at Biblical themes from children's literature. So when I found that book...I couldn't resist and did a series on Harry Potter in the church I was serving.

How do I deal with the fact that J.K. Rowling has made what many would consider disparaging remarks about transgender people? Some believe that Paul hated women because of various scriptures, but that does not stop me from reading him. I will be preaching about Harry Potter and his life, not J.K. Rowling.

How do I deal with the fact that Hogwart's is, after all, a school about witchcraft and wizardry? I have known for a long time that even Christianity can be used for good or for evil. I believe that the same is true for witchcraft and wizardry. I will never forget when a member of the community died in Harrisburg, one of the people from my church attended the funeral and called me afterward incensed that a witch had conducted the service! I asked, "What did she do?" He said that she read poetry. My response was that was appropriate for his life. Then we had a conversation about witchcraft and how it can be used in good ways and is based on natural rhythms. Remember the Salem witch trials? Harry Potter is about the power of love—especially a parent's love—and how if you have the courage to stand for what is right, that will win in the end. Is that not what we believe? It is also about Hope...that hope always exists. That is what we have just spent four weeks in Advent worship realizing...that hope is there if we allow God to meet us wherever we find ourselves. Watch how that plays out in Harry's story!

We will be tempted to say there is good and there is evil...but don't jump too quickly to what belongs in what house. We are tempted to not like the Slytherins but great people who work for good have come from that camp...and we may not know how it all plays out...Join me on the journey, won't you? It should be fun!

He leads us on an unforgettable tour of monuments and landmarks across the United States—those that are honest about the past and those that are not. Together they offer a story about how slavery has been central in shaping our nation's collective history and memory. Beginning January 16.

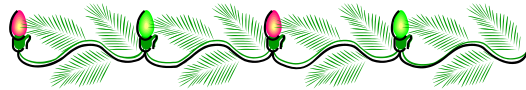

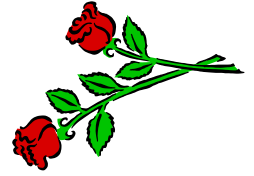
