# Lenten Study begins March 2



We have learned from Harry Potter, one with whom many of you were not even acquainted. Now the question is, can you learn from words many of you have repeated so many times you cannot even count the number?

Our Lenten Study will challenge you to do just that! During the Lenten Season, which begins with Ash Wednesday, we will study the Lord's Prayer. Each week, we will examine another line of the prayer. We will speak the whole prayer. We will sing it three different ways. We may even challenge you to pray it backwards! Could you do that? What was Jesus really teaching his disciples...and us...by saying, "When you are praying...pray then in this way..."? Many of us know the Lord's Prayer by heart. We pray it often, at different times and in different settings. But do we really understand and appreciate the meaning and power of its words, what we ask of God each time we pray it?

When the disciples asked Jesus how to pray, Jesus gave them this prayer. He likely taught it to his followers often, not just one time. He never intended the Lord's Prayer to be a museum piece, framed and placed on a mantel or in a display case. It was Jesus teaching God's people, through his disciples, how to pray.

In *The Lord's Prayer: The Meaning and Power of the Prayer Jesus Taught*, pastor and bestselling author Adam Hamilton guides us to really know—and really pray—the Lord's Prayer. He explores each of its rich lines and their meaning in the Bible, illuminating what we ask of God and what we ask of ourselves through its words. And he teaches us how to use it as a pattern for our own prayer life.

We will use this as a guide for our services each Sunday and will teach it in smaller groups on Sunday morning at Faith Formation (9:00 a.m.) and on Tuesday Morning at Bible Study (10:00 am – except on 2<sup>nd</sup> Tuesday March 8 and April 12 when it will be 1:00 p.m.). Salem UCC will also be doing the same study and Pastor Julie Brown will offer a small group on Wednesday nights at 7 p.m. Please see Pastor Eva for a copy of the book.

## Reflections from the Pastor

As I sat with Fay Gentzler today, she was remembering a tree that was outside her apartment before she went to Country Meadows and now Autumn House East. She loved to watch the tree...especially in the fall as it changed color. One fall it was awesome in its color and she was so thankful. Then a big storm came along and blew all but three leaves off the tree. "Why God? Why did you take all those beautiful leaves off the tree? I enjoyed them so much!" She was really angry at God.

Then another resident suggested to her, "Perhaps God left you three leaves to remind you of the Trinity, Creator, Redeemer and Spirit." Fay decided perhaps she shouldn't be so mad at God. Maybe God was reminding her, that after all, God knows better and didn't leave her without anything. God left her with a sign that God was not only present but in three forms!

Often, we find ourselves in life thinking that God does not care. Or we ask ourselves, "Why God?" Why does this loved one have to suffer? Why couldn't my finances be in better shape? Why did I have to lose this job? Why couldn't I get that promotion at work? Why do doors keep closing on me when I have asked God to open them?

We may never know the "why" of any of these questions. But what the story that Fay shared reminds us is that no matter what the "why" question is, God can be found in the midst of any circumstance life throws at us. Too often, we get caught up in simply feeling angry at God for not approaching life in the same way we do. Instead, we might begin to notice **where** God is or listening to **what** God might be wanting to say to us.

Our Spiritual Life is not to be lived out only in our terms. If we want to be in relationship with God, then like any relationship, there is shared communication, shared trust, a belief that neither you nor God will walk away but be present for each other. That takes a willingness to be vulnerable before God and risk that how God sees any situation, may differ from what we see and experience. Instead of asking "Why?", we may ask ourselves, "Where is God in the midst of this?" If we live expecting to see God in the midst of ALL of life, we are likely to find God in ALL of life.
