Lilly will stay around outside for some petting following worship. (The Music and Worship Team has plans to keep any accidents from hurting the carpet.)

April 17, Easter, we will join in worship **at 9:30 a.m.!** There will be no Faith Formation on Easter Sunday. Reflections from the Pastor

For the Kingdom, The Power and the Glory Are YOURS Now and Forever!

This Lenten Season we have been blessed as we have considered what we pray, when we pray the Lord's Prayer. We are praying as a community, not as individuals. Heaven is not always out there but can be the air we breathe and God can be that close. Prayer is less about asking God to do something than it is about forming our hearts to God's that we might live out what we pray. We make God's name holy by the way we live. Early Christians may have prayed this prayer three times every day, not asking for "daily" bread, but for that which gives substance to our very existence. What is more essential for our lives and other lives than forgiveness? We will still examine the questions of "Who will lead us?" and "Who, ultimately, has the power?"

So as we pray this prayer anew, what is God preparing your heart to accomplish? How might you reach out to another who really is hungry for the essentials of life, to have food security, or housing, or simply knowing they belong to a community that will lift each other (and the world) up? How is someone to find such a community unless we take the time to listen and share with those who cross our path? No longer can we simply pray the prayer that Jesus taught and walk away unchanged. We must allow God to change us and use us to change the world. Isn't that what Jesus intended when he used this prayer as an example of how we should pray? Let's have a revolution of prayer!

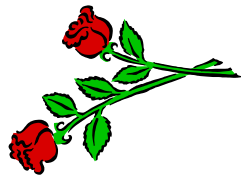
