HERITAGE SUNDAY

Did you know that when Dover UCC began to meet there were NO churches in Dover? Dover UCC did not have that name until 1957! And when churches began in Dover, back in 1854, we met as a Sunday School. All the faithful came together and met for worship, teaching and sometimes even a picnic. We are going to celebrate that **HERITAGE on Sunday, July 31** with ALL the UCC and Lutheran congregations in Dover and Shiloh meeting for worship together **at the Salem UCC picnic grove!** That's right! We are going back to our roots! At one point, we were all ONE and on Heritage Sunday, we are going to celebrate that!

Worship will be at 10:30 a.m. with Rev. Dr. Carrie Call, Penn Central Conference of the United Church of Christ Minister, preaching. She loves history and is excited to be part of this opportunity. Bring a chair to sit in and enjoy worship with communion as we celebrate our heritage! (If it rains, we will meet in the sanctuary for worship and then in the shelter for the picnic.)

Following worship (with some hymn singing as well) we will have a picnic together! Dover UCC is responsible for bringing the hamburgers and hotdogs, buns, and condiments. (See Sue Storm to donate and she will need some kitchen help.) Other churches will bring other dishes. Linda Thompson will have games for the children, so bring your grandkids! We will have a Guess That Church game with facts from all the churches (Salem, Shiloh, and Dover UCC and Rohler's, Salem, Calvary, and Shiloh Lutheran) and you will need to guess which church that fact comes from! We will also recognize the longest term member present from each congregation and the oldest member present from each congregation.

If you have trouble getting around on uneven ground, you will be able to drive right up to the picnic worship area, and we will help you park the car and make sure you are safely seated. It should be a wonderful time! A fun time! A time of celebration and fellowship! Join us!

MISSION STATEMENT OF DOVER UCC...gathered in joyful community as children of God and brothers and sisters in Christ, we commit ourselves to the hearing, believing, and doing of His Word, shaping our lives by supporting one another, worshipping God, promoting justice and spreading the Gospel.

Reflections from the Pastor

I have wondered aloud in the past days, "What should be the church's response to the Supreme Court ruling striking down Roe v. Wade?" When I have asked that question in the midst of church folk, there is a resounding silence. I want to assume that is because we don't want to take sides. If we say, like my brother-in-law did on facebook, "Glad they vote to stop killing babies. Praise God they did the right thing." We forget that there are women who need to abort for health reasons or women who have been raped or experienced incest who need to abort for their own mental health. If we appear outraged (or even disappointed) at the court's decision, then we might be accused of being in favor of killing babies or we might offend someone (in my case, family) who applaud the court's decision. So how might we respond? The following statement came from our UCC national officers...

"The national officers of the United Church of Christ are speaking out against the U.S. Supreme Court decision **eliminating, after almost 50 years, the constitutional right to an abortion.**

Long before the Supreme Court decision in Roe v. Wade, the United Church of Christ, by action of the General Synod, affirmed the right of every individual to follow their personal religious and moral convictions regarding their reproductive healthcare. We continue to stand by this conviction today. This religious and moral agency includes the autonomy of birthing people to decide whether to complete or terminate a pregnancy.

Our Synod resolutions, which represent the will of the church in light of scripture, highlight the importance of ensuring access to the full range of reproductive health care regardless of race, religion, or economic status. We do not take this stand in spite of faith, but rather because of it. Throughout sacred text humankind is tasked with care of self and others. Bodily autonomy is a human right given by God.

Today's Supreme Court decision in Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization, discarding nearly 50 years of precedent, will endanger the lives and well-being of birthing people who do not choose to continue pregnancy. God loves and cares for people who have abortions, and so does the United Church of Christ. We believe all people have the right to make their own decisions about their bodies and medical treatment. We believe women have an inalienable right to shape the direction of their lives as they see fit, and no institution established by humankind should supersede such freedom...The gravity of this decision and the devastation of its impact cannot be overstated."

We must not be afraid to speak out in support of women making their own choices about reproductive rights. One judge on the court did not stop at abortion. Judge Thomas went on to write that the court should reconsider contraception, same sex marriage and other rulings. This opens the door for a lot of fear, confusion and politics, which should have NO place in the Supreme Court. Open and Affirming churches in the UCC and other denominations should be concerned for those who live in the margins of society and are affected by these decisions that are passed down. Poor women will be at a disadvantage in seeking to abort a pregnancy more so than women who are wealthy. Where would Jesus be on these issues?

Finally, if push came to shove, I don't know that I could willingly abort a pregnancy. I am in favor of life! I am pro-life. I believe in the sanctity of life. As hard as that decision is for me, I don't believe it would be any easier for any other woman or man. If a woman were to choose abortion, it is not a decision that is chosen lightly. Women will struggle, not only before seeking such a procedure, but during and after making such a decision. I do not believe that any woman will take lightly the fetus, the life, that is within her and make a decision based solely on her own comfort. If the court wants to move us back to our beginnings, (after all, they say, "It wasn't in the constitution) let's understand what is at stake. Many freedoms we enjoy now were not at issue then. It used to be argued that the Bible justified slavery, anti-semitism, homophobia, and husbands who beat their wives. Is that really what we want to return to? Not me....I believe GOD IS STILL SPEAKING!!!

That restaurant has since closed, but Becks Ice Cream is still located on Lewisberry Road where they produce 1,000 gallons of ice cream every week.

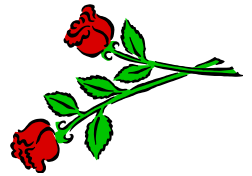
